

## *BIYC Perpetual Trophies*

The Commodore and Mrs. William Keenen Murphy Trophy - Mothers' Sabot race

The Mug of the Ancient Mariner -  
Fathers' Laser race

The Burl Johnson Memorial Trophy -  
winner of the Commodore's Cup Regatta in Sabots

The Miriam Kirk Memorial Trophy -  
winner of the Commodore's Cup Regatta in Lasers (originally Snowbirds)

The Commodore Bernie McNally Memorial Trophy -  
the most consistent winner through the summer, Sabots & Lasers

The Gene Baum Perpetual Trophy -  
Most Improved Skipper in BIYC races

The Rollins Perpetual Trophy -  
the winners of the Round the Island Row

The Birnie Family Perseverance Trophy -  
for persistence in participation

The Bock Family Endurance Award -  
for BIYC members who have competed every summer their eligibility

The Mr. & Mrs. Joseph Beek Sportsmanship Trophy -  
for outstanding enthusiasm and good sportsmanship

The Dick Munroe Memorial Trophy -  
for the overall Club Champion

*Commodore's Cups* – Sailing championship race held at the end of the summer for Lasers and Sabots. All contenders sail three races and the winners of those three races continue in additional races until someone has won three races.

*Most Improved Skipper* – for improving race results over the course of the summer.

*Round the Island Row* – held once a year, participants enter with a partner and they circumnavigate the island. Older kids tend to win, but not always. Awards are given to the three fastest teams, plus a first place award to the fastest team in each age group (either gender) and to the youngest team to finish.

*Perseverance Award* - The Perseverance Award honors any and all BIYC members who participate in every single paddleboarding, swimming, diving and rowing event throughout the summer but end up without winning a trophy. (Sailing is not included in this award.)

*Endurance Award* - This award is given to sixteen year old BIYC members who have participated every summer that they were eligible to compete.

*Sportsmanship Award* – Originally designed along the lines of the Perseverance Award, this trophy is now presented to a member, selected by the officers, who exemplifies kindness, good humor and helpfulness throughout the summer, expressing the best traits of true sportsmanship.

*Munroe Trophy* – Memorial honoring BIYC member Dick Munroe, who was killed in World War II. Dick was a terrific all-around sportsman, so his trophy is awarded based on a calculation that gives points for every event. Final tally honors top ten kids who accumulate the most points for all their activities. Sailing is included, so highest ranks generally end up going to those who sail. Winner is considered All-Around Champion of the Club. Points are tallied by Dick's brother, BIYC Staff Commodore Ted Munroe.
