

Below, the directors share their goals and dreams, favorite museum events and moments, and why they chose the Museum to devote their time, talents, and treasure.

### WHY MUSEUM?

"Growing up in New York, my friends played outside. I went to museums ... Modern Art, Natural History, Guggenheim ... never a bad day at a museum," Paula Castanon.

"The Museum has painstakingly researched the history of Balboa Island, its construction from a sand spit to an island, its influx of residents ... I knew I would enjoy working with others who cherish the uniqueness of this Island community," Barbara Abbott.

"Shirley Pepys introduced me. So impressed with the dedication and passion she and the other board members put into preserving the history of Balboa Island. I knew my financial background could (help) take the Museum to the next level," Bernadette Peterson.





"Brings the community together," Castanon says of the Sunday Suppers.



"My proudest achievement - saving 'Mustard,' the yellow horse that generations of kids have ridden on the sidewalk of Marine Avenue. It was repainted black, renamed 'Mustang,' and now lives in front of the Museum," Abbott.

"Biggest goal for the museum in 2022 is raising funds to eventually buy our building, which would guarantee (it) for generations to come," Abbott.

"Ultimate goal is buying our building. Can you imagine the Guggenheim not owning its building?" Castanon.
